Job purpose

We are seeking a project lead to address transportation barriers for survivors in rural, remote, and northern communities to increase survivors' access to services, and achieve economies of scale. You understand the needs of rural communities and have a solid understanding of domestic violence. This is a term position with the potential of becoming permanent.

Duties and responsibilities

- Consult with ACWS members and other community partners on transportation barriers and needs in rural, remote, and northern communities, to identify existing initiatives and options.
- Through consultation and a literature review, identify current best practices and promising programs that could be piloted in select communities across the province.
- Bring together project partners to pilot effective approaches to addressing transportation barriers. Results from the pilots would then be applicable to similar regions.
- Develop a business case for a sustainable program.
- Perform day-to-day project management duties relating to project design, documentation, meetings, reporting, and evaluation.
- Initiate and move the project plan forward.
- Act as the primary contact for project-related communications.
- Prepare project reports for related funders.
- Monitor project progress and provide timely updates to the Executive Director.
- Prepare content for project webpage and social media postings.
- Prepare project documentation and research reports for management review.
- Work with the Executive Director and Manager of HR, IT, and Finance to prepare project plans, budgets and schedules.
- Organize meetings to discuss project status and issues with relevant participants.
- Ensure all project participants and funders have current, up-to-date, timely and relevant information.
- Inform ACWS staff and members of project progress, findings and training opportunities.
- Support the dissemination of results through conference presentations, published articles and journals.
