

Using the Websites




- Simulate a real client experience



19% Health Services





What is human trafficking?


Palermo Protocol

Act of **forcing**, **coercing**, or **deceiving** an individual into selling sex or labour to a **third party's** gain.






What is human trafficking?



Traffickers undertake **ACTIONS** using **MEANS** for the **PURPOSE** of exploiting people.



Child and youth trafficking



Child and youth traffickers undertake ACTIONS for the PURPOSE of exploiting young people.



Purpose of trafficking

Sexual Exploitation





Labour Trafficking

Overall, the top 3 risk factors of labor trafficking are:

- Recent migration
- Economic hardship
- Unstable housing





Sex Trafficking

Overall, the top 3 risk factors of sex trafficking are:


- Substance use concern
- Runaway/Unhoused youth







Human Smuggling




One person pays another to transport them across international borders. When the payment is made and the border is crossed, the smuggling relationship ends.

Sex Work




Sex work entails a willing engagement in commercial sex while sex trafficking involves force, coercion, or deceit.




